

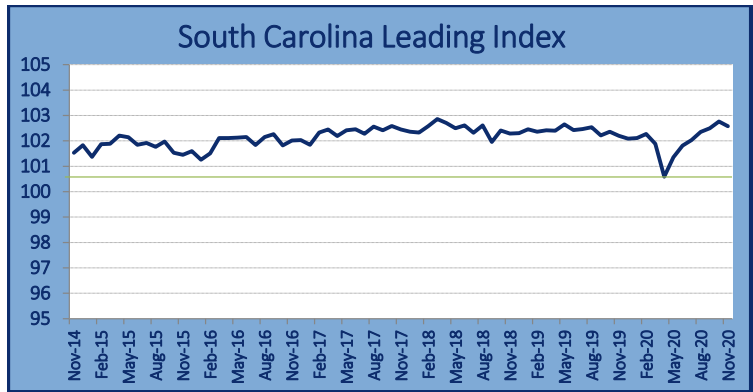

ECONOMIC OUTLOOK

The South Carolina Leading Index (SCLI) fell 0.19 points last month, ending with a value (following revisions) of 102.58.

SCLI metrics were mixed in November. Unemployment claims were 22.3 percent lower than in October. The number of issued housing permits decreased 7.1 percent month-over-month and valuation for the permits fell 14.0 percent. Average weekly manufacturing hours fell 2.4 percent. The Dow Jones Composite Average was up 10.1 percent.

The Conference Board's national Leading Economic Index increased in November to 109.1. This is the seventh consecutive month with a gain. Index readings above 100 forecast economic expansion, though the pace of growth seems to be slowing as the country nears 2021.

Non-Seasonally Adjusted Wage and Salary Employment

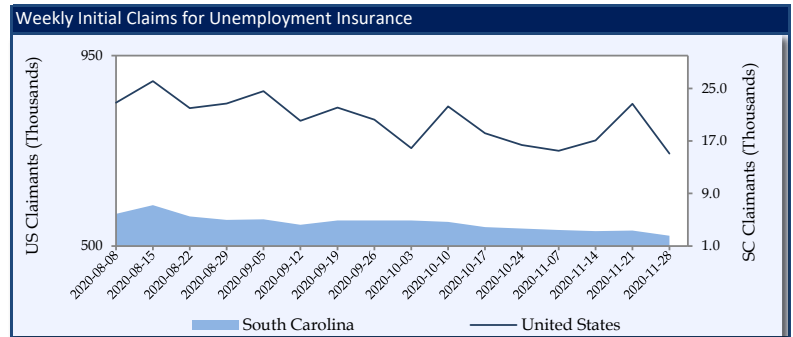
South Carolina's total non-seasonally adjusted nonfarm employment rose by 23,100 net jobs to 2,152,200 in November, a 1.1 percent increase from revised October numbers but 2.3 percent lower than one year ago. Nearly all sectors reported net job gains for the month, including Trade, Transportation and Utilities (10,900); Professional and Business Services (4,400); Manufacturing (1,500); Educational and Health Services (1,400); Leisure and Hospitality (1,100); Construction (1,000); Government (1,000); Other Services (900); Finance (500); and Information (400). Natural Resources and Mining was unchanged from October. Compared to one year ago, the state economy lost 51,500 net nonfarm jobs.

Weekly Unemployment Claims

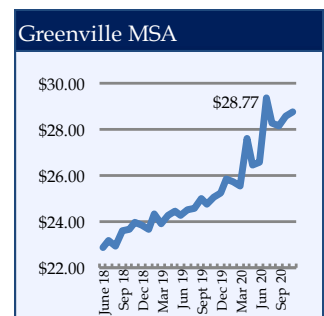
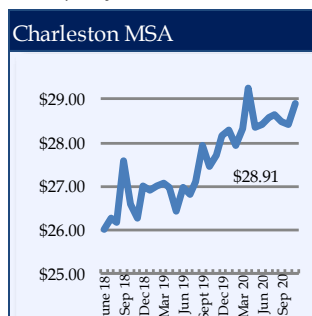
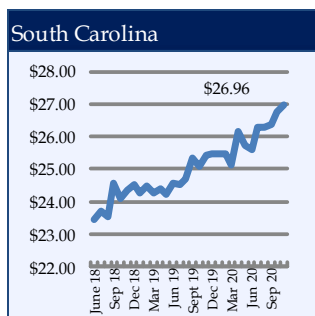

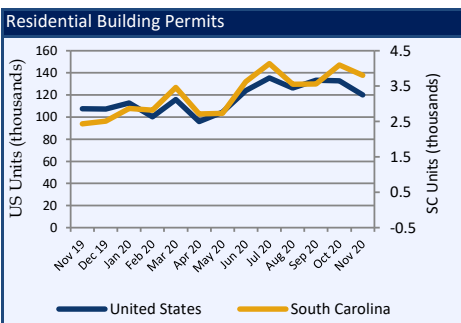
Real Estate & Business Activity

In November, the number of building permits issued in South Carolina for new residential construction fell 7.1 percent to 3,805. This figure was up 56.3 percent from one year ago. Valuation for the permits fell 14.0 percent month-over-month and was 37.4 percent higher than one year ago. Total closings were down 15.9 percent compared to October, while the median sales price was up 1.8 percent. Total closings fell in all six MSAs, with Florence reporting the steepest drop (-19.2 percent). Median sales price rose in all MSAs but Greenville month-over-month, with Myrtle Beach leading the way, up 4.9 percent.

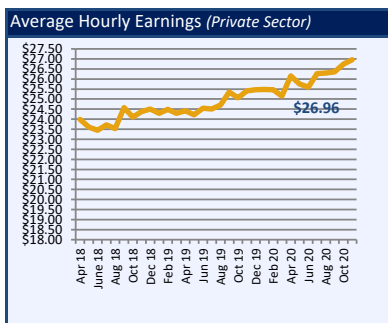

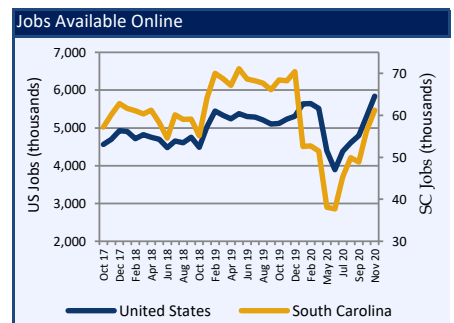

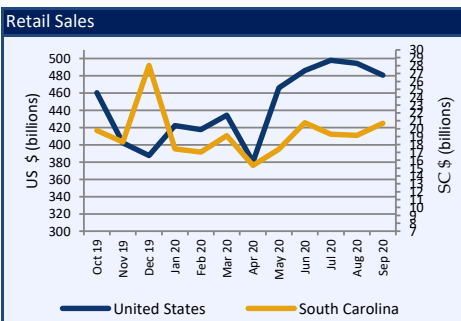

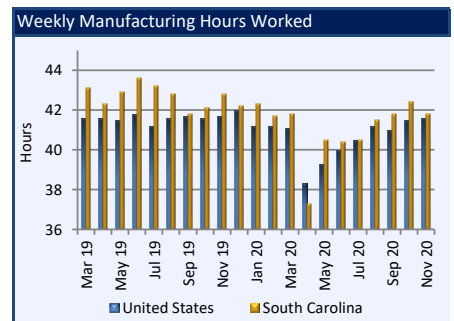

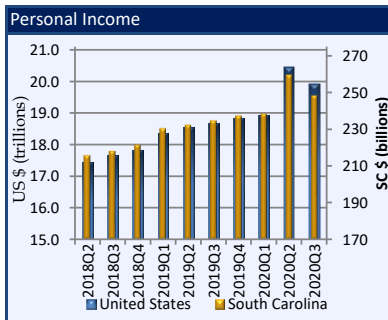

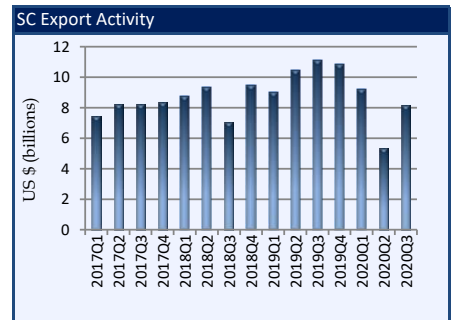
Income and Output
